

- Q. Are you going to retain the jail and court consultants who provide the jail and court needs assessments?

A. We do not have current plans to do so. We look to an architectural firm to determine whether or not they would need further advice from a court/jail consultant(s). If a proposing firm believes it is appropriate to include such a consultant on their team, it should be reflected in section 2 and possibly section 8 of the proposal. If desired, consultants may be noted in section 4 as well.

- Q. May a proposing firm provide additional materials, either appended to their proposal or separately?

A. Yes, however there is no guarantee that we will review additional materials. The 20 pages (or less) of each proposal must stand on its own.

- Q. As long as the proposal does not exceed 20 pages overall, may a proposal section contain more pages than the number specified for that section in the RFP?

A. Yes. As long as the proposal does not exceed 20 pages overall, an individual section of the proposal may contain more or fewer pages than the number of pages specified parenthetically in the RFP. This pertains to sections 1, 2, 3, 4 and 8.

- Q. Who will be involved in the selection process?

A. The CCJAC will review proposals. Any interviews will involve the CCJAC and possibly some or all of the County Commissioners. CCJAC will recommend which proposal to accept. The County Commissioners will make the final decision.

- Q. What do you have in mind for "Public awareness campaign services?"

A. We expect this to include: 1) assistance in defining the key points to inform voters about a justice facility project 2) assistance in developing informational materials and ways of presenting information 3) assistance at public meetings and/or with local media.
